What Happens During a Mentor Visit?

After the teacher and the mentor have decided on the best day and time for the visits to take place, the mentors will begin their journey of getting to know the mentees. The first several visits will be all about getting to know each other. The mentors work with the teachers during this time to help determine the children's needs and how to structure their visits.

Our mentors do different activities during their visits.

- 1.Enjoy conversation and work on social skills during a lunch-time visit.
- 2. Enjoy quiet reading time at the library.
- 3. Work on classroom assignments that have not been completed.
- 4. Spend time supporting the child during specific subject times in the classroom.
- 5. Take a walk to have private one-on-one conversation.
- 6. Take the child out of the class to work on activities the mentor has prepared.

In January of 2009 Miss Ruby's Kids launched its school based Education Mentor Program at Waccamaw Elementary School. We were able to serve 13 of our program graduates with mentors for the remainder of that school year. We have expanded since then to serve several more area schools. One of our goals is to serve all of our graduates in all of the Georgetown County Elementary Schools.

One aspect of the program that has helped to make it so successful is the flexibility the mentors have. Mentors are able to serve their mentees in a way that the children will benefit the most. After the mentors have had the chance to get to know their mentees and their needs, they are able to plan activities that will support their needs.


