



Education Mentor Program (EMP)



Dear Friends of Miss Ruby's Kids,

In these tough economic times, the loyal support of friends like you has not only allowed Miss Ruby's Kids to continue preparing Georgetown County children for success in school and life. It has also enabled us to increase and expand our services.

During the 2011-2012 program year, we served 56 children and their families, as well as providing quality training for three family child care homes through the Parent-Child Home Program. Fifty-three of our "graduates" received school visits and friendly encouragement from 50 "mentors," volunteers who have signed on to our Education Mentor Program. We were also able to add a part-time Education Mentor Program Coordinator to our Miss Ruby's Kids office staff. Parenting classes were offered to all current and former program parents, and special workshops held to assist local child care providers in strengthening and improving the quality of their programs.

Miss Ruby's Kids continued to provide leadership along with various groups advocating for the underserved citizens of Georgetown County. Among these organizations are the Georgetown VISTA Collaborative, the Early Learning Council, and the Georgetown County School District. We look forward to providing ongoing collaborative leadership as we strive to bring Georgetown County children and their families forward to a brighter future. We are proud of this record of our most recent achievements and fully acknowledge that none of them would have been possible without the good will, encouragement, and support we have received from you, our friends, and our community. On behalf of the staff, Board of Directors, and volunteers for Miss Ruby's Kids, I express our sincere appreciation.




