Johnson will be demonstrating how parents can be everyday C.O.A.C.H.E.S. Dr. Johnson's Zoom Calls are accessible by everyone in her audience. The sessions are always interactive, fun, engaging and will definitely shake away a little pandemic angst.

Dr. Kimberly P. Johnson is a Literacy Advocate, Educational Consultant and Children's Author. She has achieved many post graduate degrees in education and behavior. She received her Doctorate in Curriculum, Teaching, and Leadership from Northeastern University in Boston, MA. Kimberly is a creative thinker and has a passion for teaching and helping others.

During her "unconventional" webinar Dr. Johnson said she will be talking about how, "Literacy and reading go hand and hand. You must play with words to bring them to life. Words alone cannot be isolated." She will also talk about, "how to take ordinary things to make them come to life in the learning arena."

Dr. Johnson said her webinar will be relatable for older children and their parents as well. She commented, "For older children reading opens the door to more curiosity about themselves and the world. These interests should be encouraged. Parents need to have probing conversations with their children." The conversations should be organic and open ended. Any type of caregiver can suggest different types of reading on personal interests that can be explored together.
