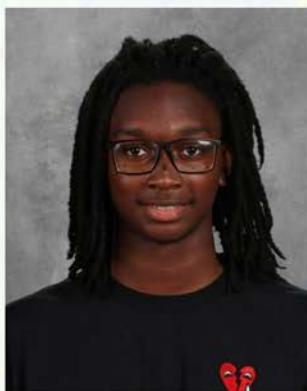

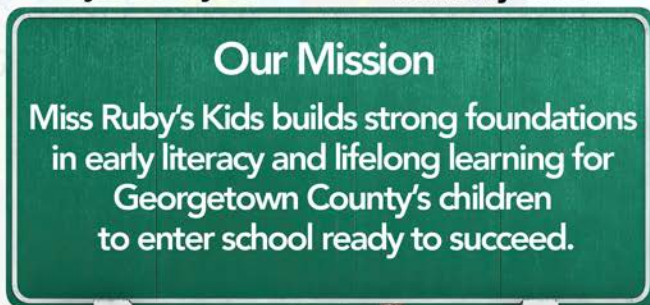

Our Programs

ParentChild+ Program

MRK provides families with gifts of high-quality books and educational toys which are the curricular materials used in 92 twice-weekly home visits to encourage positive parent-child verbal interaction and support the development of children's school readiness skills.

Home-based Childcare Program

Early Learning Specialists build relationships with home-based child care (HBCC) providers to give professional learning support that is individualized to capitalize on their talents. Over the course of the program, providers receive 48 home visits and acquire a library of books and educational toys.

Education Mentor Program

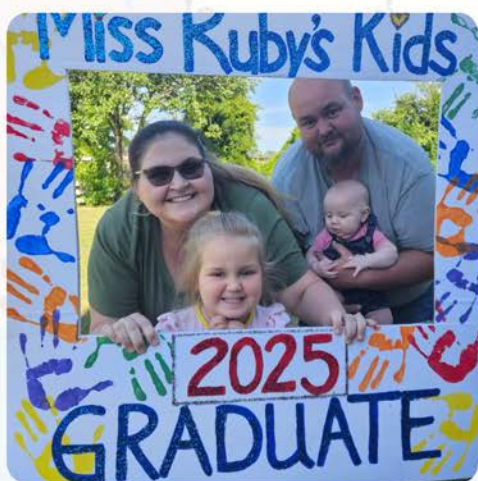
MRK ParentChild+ Graduates are assigned a volunteer mentor once they enter school. Mentors visit the children once a week and provide much needed support for them as they progress in their educational journey.

Miss Ruby's Kids supports community libraries located in targeted areas of Georgetown County to provide free age-appropriate, culturally-relevant books for children to take home and keep.







A Family's Path to Success



When Jhustyn and Jhourdyn were just two years old, their mother learned about Miss Ruby's Kids from a friend who had participated in the program. A firm believer in the power of education, she wanted to give her twins every opportunity to start strong. "I've always been big on education and wanted to start them on the right path," she said.

At that time, the twins were in an in-home daycare setting, and she was eager to nurture their curiosity early. The ParentChild+ program gave her the tools and confidence to do just that. The home visits quickly became a highlight for the family. "The twins loved the days when new books or educational toys were introduced," she recalled. "Their faces lit up." Those moments turned learning into something joyful and strengthened her confidence as a parent. "The visits helped me learn different ways to teach them and the methods they enjoyed most."

As the twins entered elementary school, their journey with Miss Ruby's Kids continued through the Education Mentor program, where they were assigned to Tom and Lynn. What began as a mentoring relationship soon grew into something much deeper. "They became family," their mother shared. "The twins absolutely adored them. They were present for everything — even Grandparents Day at school."

The steady encouragement and guidance the twins received gave them a lasting sense of pride and motivation. "They knew they always had extra people rooting for them," their mother said. "That support made them more motivated to do well in school, stay on the honor roll, and keep striving for excellence."



Now, years later, Jhustyn and Jhourdyn are thriving young leaders. Jhourdyn is a member of the Praise Team at Mt. Zion Baptist Church and runs track at Waccamaw High School. Jhustyn plays on the Varsity Football and Track Teams. Both are college-bound students with 3.8 GPAs. They are well-rounded, confident, and determined. "They're positive leaders and do a great job of separating themselves from things that don't seem right," their mom said with pride.

Even though time has passed, and Tom and Lynn have moved away, the bond with their mentors remains strong. "We still communicate and miss them dearly," she shared. "The kids and I text and talk with them on Facebook." Now juniors, Jhustyn and Jhourdyn remain active participants, engaging regularly in group mentoring at Waccamaw High School.

For her, the connection between her family and Miss Ruby's Kids goes beyond a program — it's a foundation for lifelong success. "They are walking success stories because of the foundation that was started through Miss Ruby's Kids," she said. Their love for learning was enhanced at a young age. They are great in school and in life."

And for the people whose generosity makes that possible, she offers heartfelt gratitude:

"This is an invaluable program and an excellent base for early childhood development through high school for both the child and the parents. MRK provides educational supplies, tools, and guidance for many families to help boost a child's love for learning. I can't even imagine life without it. I strongly recommend this program to everyone and will forever be grateful for everyone who played a role in helping me get and keep my children on the right path."
